Lead Article Can You Face Yourself

Many times today, these days, our sermons are so filled with the thought and emphasis of material gain and prosperity, blessings, that we often lose sight of the responsibilities that we have as Christians. It is almost like raising a child and never telling them about the consequences of their actions, but only telling them of the rewards of good behavior. Regardless of what is desired, the child will do wrong sometimes, and sometimes must be brought down to reality no matter how much the truth may hurt them. The same thing applies to us, that no matter how much we try to void out the consequences of our actions with talk of blessings and forgiveness, each and every one of us will one day go before judgment, and all that we have done we will have to face up to it before God.

If anyone has ever read tracts before, you know that they are often very blunt and sometimes very gruesome. When you read them they can literally scare the devil out of you, it seems. They speak about Hell so vividly and painfully, kind of like the “Brimstone and Fire” preachers used to preach. While truly, God’s forgiveness is unparalleled to anything that we can even imagine here on Earth, so also is His justice in dealing with evil. And like it or not, sin is evil, so if we continue to participate in it, we might also be subject to that same

judgment that God delivers on the heathen. The Bible clearly tells us of the ways of sin in *Gal. 5: 19-21* where it states those...*which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God.* The Bible also tells us that all things done in darkness shall be brought to light. This is the importance of this teaching. I repeat: all things done in darkness shall be brought to light. We can’t trick God, we can’t hide anything from God, we can’t swindle God out of His rulings, but the most that we can do is repent when we mess up and keep working harder to not mess up again. The problem comes when we fail to do so though. So many times, so often, we choose to do what we want to do, when we want to do it, and straight up refuse to take it to God and repent.

Therefore a good question arises. I challenge you to take a review of the things you have done today, this week, this month, or even this year. This is not about those things you talked to others about, or said in church, but rather those things that you were too ashamed to share with anyone else. Take a look at those things that would destroy you if anyone found out, and that would discredit you in the public eye. There are some things we openly admit of wrong, but some we don’t confess; some that we think would cause others to never take us serious again if discovered. These are the things that we need God the most for; these are the things that need repentance. One day, maybe today, tomorrow, next week, our 40 years from now, we are going to come face to face with our creator. All these things that we have done from the beginning of our human lives to the final

death will have to be accounted for. This time, there will be nowhere we can run, nowhere we can hide, and no excuse that can be created. There will be no one there with you, just you alone before God, with no escape, and every one of those issues will be brought forth. Will you be able to face yourself? Will you be able to look at Jesus? Will you be able to look at the one who suffered for your sins? Will you be able to look into the eyes of the one whose suffering was relived with each sin you committed?

With each action that we do, every word that we say, and every thought that we think, we should learn to weigh those consequences. It's just like a credit card, you may be having your fun right now, but one day, GUARANTEED, it will catch back up with you... and me, and him, and her, etc. Will you be able to face Him? Consider this boldly, for regardless it is inevitable. He can forgive, He is willing to forgive, but if we don't ask, we cannot receive, and if we are not sincere, our words are worthless. Waste no time, and be ready, to face Him.

Health Tips

This month's health tip is all about the eyes. As we enter the spring and summer months, there is an increase of pollen and other allergens in the air that can cause great irritation to our eyes. You might very often begin to notice things like itchiness and burning that refuses to go away. While it would be great to have air purifiers everywhere we go, it is not very likely due to the expensive nature of most purifiers, but the cleaner the air is around us, the better. It would also be of benefit to regularly visit the eye doctor for checkups, as time and finances permit. A more reasonable, and less expensive way to ease this irritation though is with eye drops. While I don't endorse any particular brand, I will advise that there are some that are specifically for rewetting, and

others are specifically designed for allergy relief, but what's best for you may easily vary from that of someone else. The moisture is the most important factor though. Be sure to keep those eyes moisturized, and protected (via sunglasses, hats, staying away from smoke, etc.) and you can begin to see things in a new light.
