Lead Article The Power of "No"

Sometimes in life we discover that the smallest things can be the most powerful. So, it is so easy to miss the value of such a small word, "no," and how impacting it can be in our everyday lives as followers of Christ. I pray that this message brings you deliverance from the guilt so often found in using the word "no" and gives you the strength to use it at all times that it is appropriate. Let's go to scripture.

Matthew 5:37 (NIV) – Simply let your 'Yes' be 'Yes,' and your 'No,' 'No'; anything beyond this comes from the evil one.

James 5:12 (NIV) – But above all [things], my brethren, do not swear, either by heaven or by earth or by any other oath; but let your yes be [a simple] yes, and your no be [a simple] no, so that you may not sin and fall under condemnation.

Looking at these scriptures teaches us, or reminds us of the danger of having "gray area" in our lives. The following scripture also confirms the issue of being in "gray area," which is also referred to as "straddling the fence."

Revelation 3:16 (NIV) – So, because you are lukewarm—neither hot nor cold—I am about to spit you out of my mouth.

In Christ, and following righteousness, we are told to be firm in our stance, unwavering and secure, just as Jesus is security and truth. Thus in our communication, we should also do the same. The scriptures tell us to be simple in our answers because in not doing so, they lead to evil. How? Let's look at examples.

If someone asks you to do something you don't want to do, you should answer, "No," firmly and move on. If you get into telling them you'll think about it, and then they manage to talk you, or GUILT YOU, into doing it, then you will develop bitterness in doing the task, which would not be honoring to God. It could also just cause additional animosity from the simple pressure caused by the requestor. A perfect example of that is found with door to door salespeople. When you choose to be "nice" by entertaining their sales pitch, acting like you are actually considering it though knowing that you don't want to buy what they are selling, you then try to say no thanks and they keep pushing as if they don't understand it now. Then you find yourself in a frustrating situation that could have been avoided by simply saying "No!" from the start. And, you both end up angry at each other because of it.

Please know, for your own sanctity, sanity, and peace inside, that there is nothing wrong with saying "no" to a request that you don't feel like doing, but rather the door to sin is opened by not doing so, as then your response becomes dishonest before God. The truth is what sets you free though. Therefore, do what

is right and stand firm on your answers from the start, and say "no" when you need to do so.

Likewise, if you get offended when someone tells you "no," there is no reason to be offended. It is better that they tell you know so you can do it yourself or find someone who will do it right, than to pressure them to do it and it gets half done. It would also be immature to sit and pout, or get upset, because someone disagrees with you and/or refuses to do what you want – just as with the child who throws a tantrum when he can't get his way. There is nothing wrong with saying no, or being told no; in fact, it is righteous for this if/when done in love and honesty. It is the command of God.

I pray that you find this truth as a blessing to your soul and a comfort to your conscience. I pray that you no longer permit yourself to be held in guilt for being honest, and saying the word "no." I pray that you release the thorns of resentment for receiving an honest answer of "no" when it is given. And in all, I pray the love of God to ever-abound in your heart in all circumstances, in Jesus' name. Amen.
