Lead Article Christian Service vs Christian Procedures

What does it mean to be in true Christian service, as this is the duty of all followers of Christ, to serve? As we all know, ministry is service. It is not a basis of fundamental procedures that we do as a routine before man, but rather an expression of God's love, which benefits mankind. Service is the goal, not procedure; let's take a look at the differences.

In the manner of procedures, we have things that are regular actions for us. Yet, the weakness occurs from the loss of merit in those things. We fall into the traps of tradition and allow those traditions to have more authority that the Holy Spirit himself. Let us not be like the Pharisees referred to in the book of **Matthew** (chapter six): performing procedures to be seen. In fact, Jesus told us not to even do those things (pray, give alms, etc.) before men, to be seen by man, for then man's recognition is your reward. He told us to pray in secret, to give alms in secret, to fast without letting man know that we are doing these acts, and for that which we do in privacy, we shall be openly rewarded by the Father. But, question yourself and the "sacraments" that you perform. Do you go to church out of routine? Do you pray and fast to be seen? Do you give for recognition in the newspaper or to have your name announced in the church? If so, these are only procedure,

but yet the true service of the Lord is so much greater.

The duty of man is to fear God and keep His commandments (Ecclesiastes 12:13). This duty establishes the groundwork for the service of the Lord. As just read in His word, the duty of man is to keep His commandments, and He summarized all of the commandments as love (Matthew 29. And Jesus answered him, The first of all the commandments is, Hear, O Israel; The Lord our God is one Lord: **30.** And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this is the first commandment. 31. And the second is like, namely this, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. There is none other commandment greater than these.). True Christian service is nothing less than love. What happened to such Christian service as loving each other and respecting eachother as yourself? What happened to sharing the gospel news of Christ with no strings attached? What happened to taking care of the widows and homeless, and visiting the sick and imprisoned? True Christian service is shown through love; the same type of love, in fact, that Christ shared to us when He gave His life for our salvation. Rather than gossiping about people's misfortunes, we should be praying for their deliverance. Rather than tearing eachother down, acting like we're better than them, we should be eachother up. Such is the service of a Christian. Are you serving Christ, or just using Christian procedures to impress man?
